When Henry realises his best shot at accessing top surgery is by faking an engagement to his friend Cooper, he learns it isn't easy to plan a wedding, even a fake one. His mum wants to control everything, his dad is convinced that nonbinary Cooper is a closeted gay man, and Henry might be developing feelings for his fake fiancé—and the Australian Government has just announced the 2017 Marriage Equality plebiscite. Is the cost of staying closeted worth the pain of coming out? What does a fake wedding mean if you're not allowed to have a real one? And is a person really torn to pieces by a crocodile in North Queensland every three months?

Briar Rolfe is a non-binary illustrator, comic artist and graphic designer who was shortlisted for a Ledger Award in 2017, and highly commended by the Kat Muscat Fellowship in 2020. Briar has spent the last five years of their practice involved in the Melbourne indie comics scene, where they have built a large body of work focusing on genre-bending, format-pushing comedy stories about young people navigating share-housing, university, coming out, and job insecurity through humour, solidarity, and friendship. 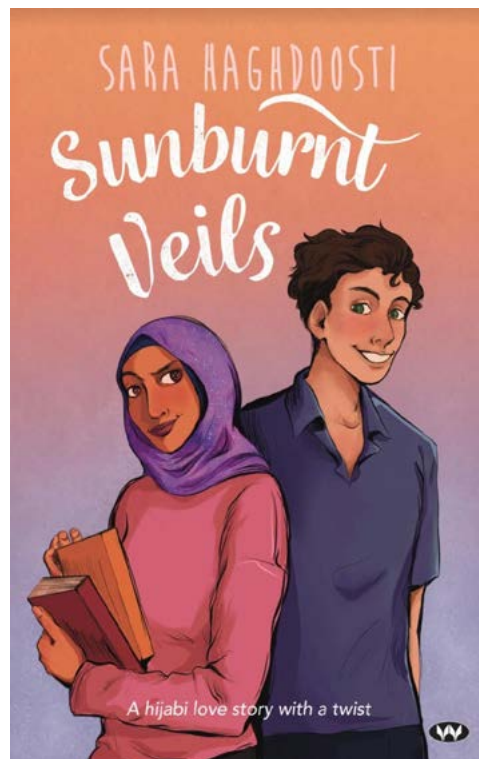

Sunburnt Veils is a smart, funny, character-based exploration of Islamophobia through a heroine who's the kind of girl who reads at parties, but pushes herself to take a stand after a fellow student calls in a bomb threat on her first day of university.

Tara is a unicorn. She wears hijab even though her parents hate it, and in a swipe right world she's looking for the 'will go to the ends of the earth for you' type of connection. Or, she would be, if she hadn't sworn off boys to focus on getting into med school. Besides, what was wrong with just crushing on the assassins, mages and thieves in the fantasy books she loved?

When a bomb threat throws her and (totally annoying party king) Alex together, things get complicated. Tara needs to decide if she's happy reading about heroes, or if she's ready to step up and become one herself.

Sara Haghdooosti was born in Tehran, grew up in Sydney and is currently based in Chicago (It generally takes her ten minutes to answer the question, "Where are you from?") She's always loved writing, and was a regional winner of the Sydney Morning Herald Young Writer of the year award.

Sara got her start in politics at the Australian Youth Climate Coalition, GetUp and Change.org, and went on to found Berim, a non-profit working to support changemakers in Iran.
